

Deuteronomy as an Expansion of the LORD's Covenant with Israel

	Commandment	Reference	Main Issue	Expansion
Divine	1] You shall have no other gods before me	Ch. 6-11	Authority of God	Not individual laws but examples of how to obey Point: God should be first priority and final authority
	2] You shall not make for yourself an idol	Ch. 12	Dignity of God	Not allowed to take over Canaanite shrines or worship God in their ways Point: not manipulative or self-serving but recognize God's unique nature
	3] You shall not misuse the name of the LORD your God	13:1-14:21	Commitment to God	E.g. chapter 14 (dietary laws) as an example of one who takes God seriously even in subtle areas of life
	4] Observe the Sabbath day by keeping it holy	14:22- 16:17	Rights & Privileges of God	Moves beyond Sabbath to other areas where God has a claim on his people (e.g. tithes)
Human	5] Honor your father and your mother	16:18- 18:22	Authority of Humans	Section expands to other forms of human authority such as judges, kings, priests, true prophecy
	6] You shall not murder	Ch. 19-21	Dignity of Humans	Dignity of existence – places where life may be taken without violating the commandment (death penalty, war) = rules
	7] You shall not commit adultery	22:1-23:14		Dignity of homogeneity? — integrity of the group not infiltrated by outsiders — reflected in not mixing seed, thread, etc.; different categories of adultery (22:12-30)
	8] You shall not steal	23:15-24:7		Dignity of Personhood – issue is dignity & vulnerability; e.g. even kidnapping is concerned with how victim was treated (24:7)
	9] You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor	24:8-16	Commitment to Humans	Responsibility of mutual trust {ME: uncertain about this category}
	10] You shall not covet	24:17- 26:15	Rights & Privileges of Humans	Protecting rights of people; should not be taken for granted
